

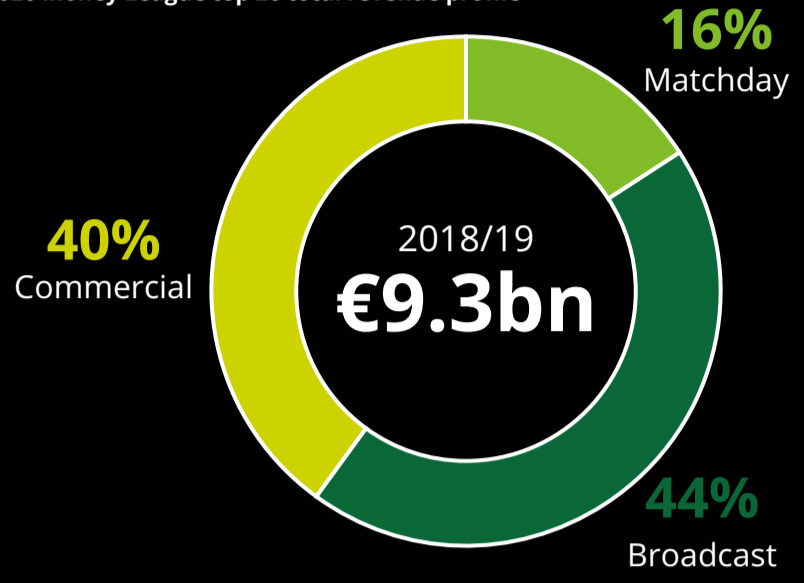

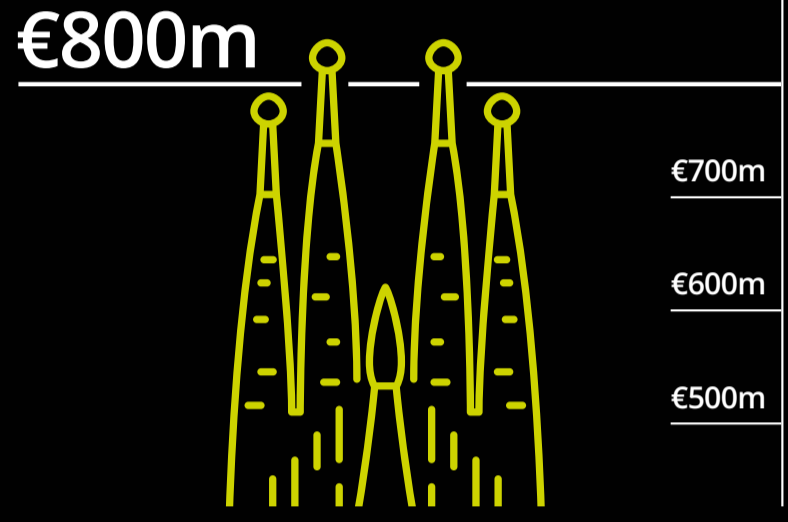

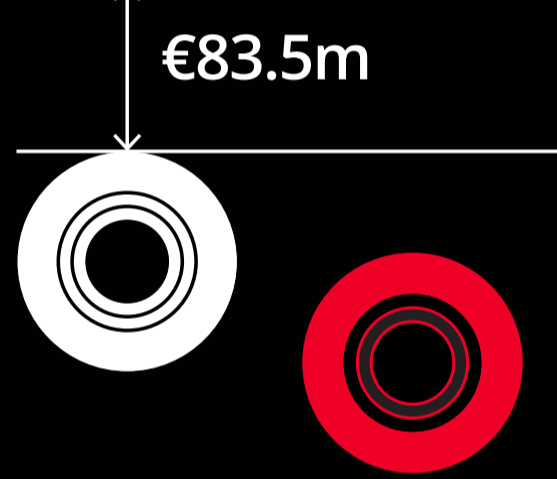
2020 Money League top 20 total revenue profile



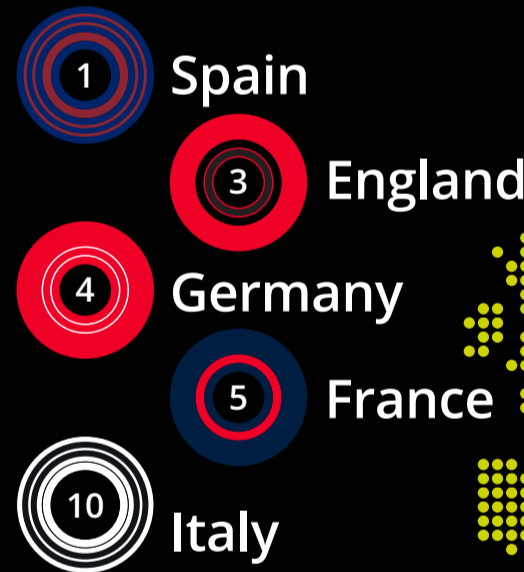
Congratulations to FC Barcelona who are the highest revenue-generating club in the world for the first time, and the first club to break the €800m barrier.



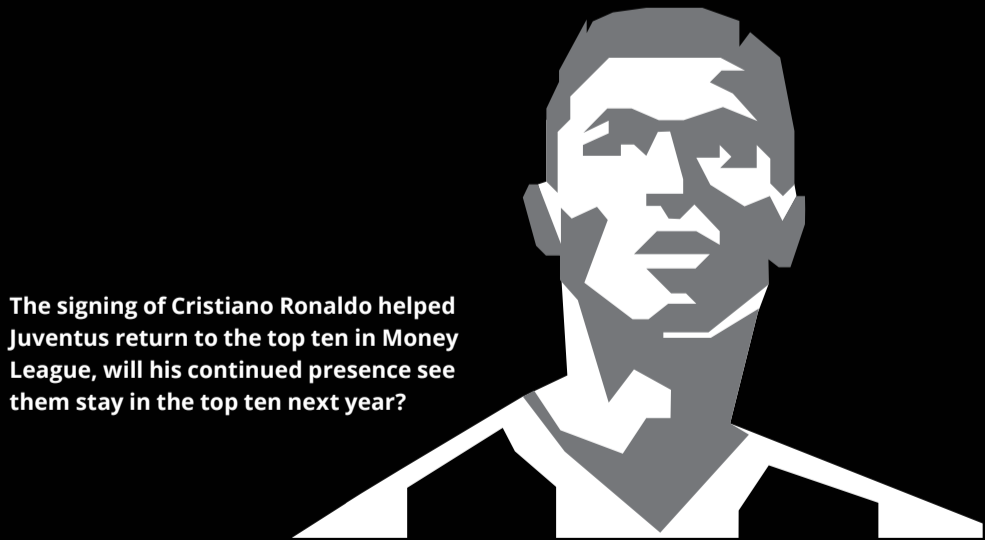
FC Barcelona has pulled away from domestic rivals Real Madrid and Money League rivals Manchester United, finishing top by the widest margin in Money League history €83.5m.



FC Barcelona, Manchester United, Bayern Munich, Paris Saint-Germain and Juventus were the highest ranked clubs in each of the 'big five' leagues

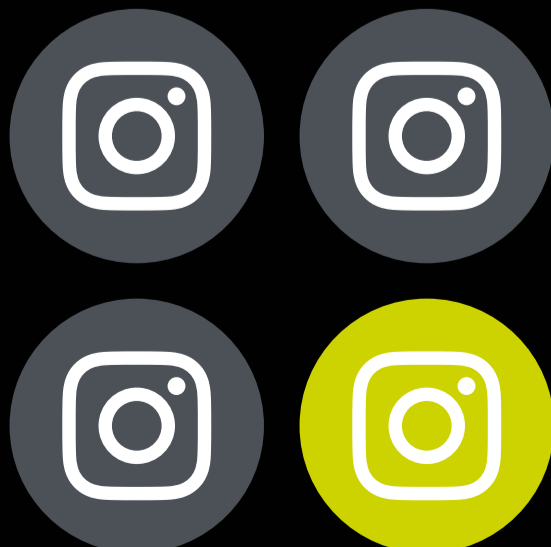
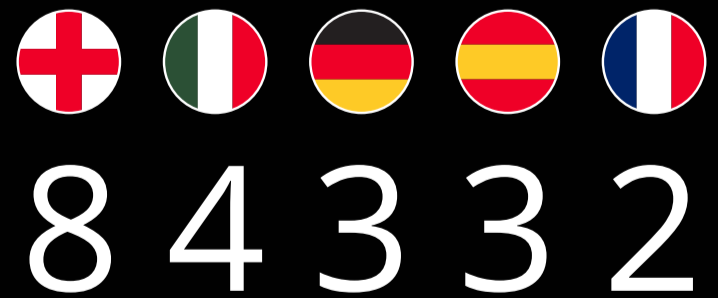


Participation in the Champions League final sees Tottenham Hotspur become London's highest revenue generating club for the first time since 1996/97.

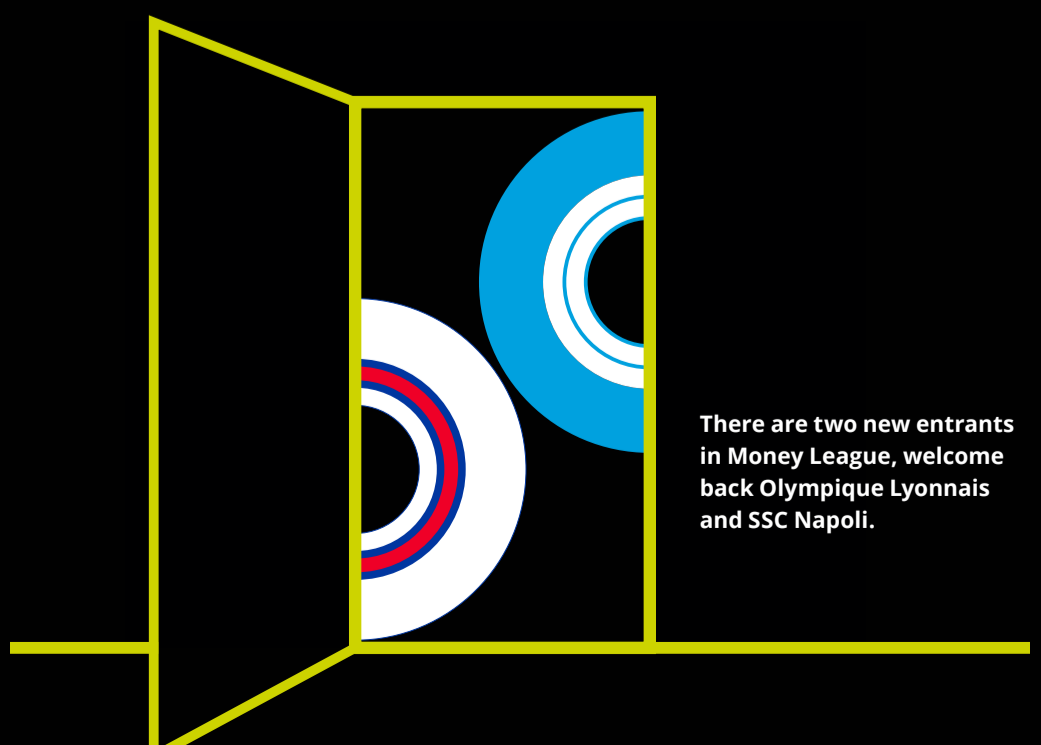


The signing of Cristiano Ronaldo helped Juventus return to the top ten in Money League, will his continued presence see them stay in the top ten next year?
